Visa



Japan eVisa for Indians



- As an Indian citizen residing in India, you are required to obtain a visa prior to visiting Japan for tourism purposes.
- Since April 1, 2024, Japan has introduced an electronic visa (eVISA) system for Indian nationals, simplifying the application process.

Key Details of the Japan eVISA:

- Type of Visa: Single-entry short-term visa for tourism, allowing a stay of up to 90 days.
- Eligibility: Indian citizens and foreign nationals residing in India.

Application Process:

- 1. Submission: Applicants must submit their visa applications through the Japan Visa Application Centers managed by VFS Global. CLICKHERE IN
- 2. Required Documents: While specific requirements may vary, generally you will need:
 - 1. A valid passport.
 - 2. Completed visa application form. Recent passport-sized photographs.
 - 3. Proof of financial stability (e.g., bank statements).
 - 4. Detailed travel itinerary. Any additional documents specified by the visa application center. For a comprehensive list of required documents and specific guidelines, refer to the VFS Global website.
- 3. Processing Time: The processing time for the eVISA may vary. It's advisable to apply well in advance of your intended travel date to accommodate any unforeseen delays.

Important Notes:

- •Application Centers: All applications must be submitted through the designated Visa Application Centers (VFS Global).
- •Visa Issuance: Upon approval, the visa will be issued electronically. Applicants will not receive a physical visa sticker in their passports but will instead be provided with an electronic visa.
- •Entry Requirements: Ensure you carry a printed copy of your eVISA when traveling, as it will be required upon entry into Japan.

About Kansai-area



Major Cities in Kansai:

Osaka (大阪) – Japan's third-largest city, known for its lively nightlife, street food (like takoyaki and okonomiyaki), and modern shopping districts. Osaka is also a major economic hub.

<u>Kyoto (京都)</u> - The former imperial capital, famous for its stunning temples, shrines, geisha culture, and traditional tea houses.

Kobe (神戸) – A cosmopolitan port city known for Kobe beef, scenic harbor views, and a mix of Western and Japanese influences.

<u>Nara (奈良)</u> – Home to Todai-ji Temple, the Great Buddha (Daibutsu), and free-roaming deer in Nara Park.

<u>Wakayama (和歌山)</u> – Known for Mount Koya (Koyasan), a major center for Shingon Buddhism, and beautiful coastal scenery.

<u>Shiga (滋賀)</u> – Features Lake Biwa, Japan's largest lake, and historic sites like Hikone Castle.



Transportation system in Osaka

Railways (Best for Tourists & Locals)

1. JR (Japan Railways) Lines:

- JR Osaka Loop Line: Circles central Osaka, stopping at major areas like Osaka, Tennoji, and Universal City (for Universal Studios Japan).
- Shinkansen (Bullet Train): Available at Shin-Osaka Station for long-distance travel (Tokyo, Hiroshima, etc.).
- 2. Osaka Metro (Subway) The best way to get around the city.
 - Midosuji Line (Red Line): Main north-south route connecting key areas (Shin-Osaka, Umeda, Namba, Tennoji).
 - Chuo Line (Green Line): Connects Osaka Castle, Cosmo Square, and Universal City via a transfer.
 - Tanimachi Line (Purple Line): Another north-south route useful for Osaka Castle and Tennoji.

3. Private Railways (Great for regional travel)

- Hankyu Railway: Best for Kyoto (Umeda ↔ Kyoto).
- Hanshin Railway Best for Kobe (Umeda \leftrightarrow Kobe).
- Keihan Railway Another good route to Kyoto (Kyobashi ↔ Kyoto)
- Kintetsu Railway Great for Nara (Osaka-Namba \leftrightarrow Nara).
- Nankai Railway: Best for Kansai Airport (KIX) & Wakayama.

Buses (Less Common for Tourists)

- Osaka has a city bus network, but most visitors prefer trains.
- Useful for certain areas like Osaka Castle Park and Osaka Bay Area.
- Airport Limousine Buses operate between Kansai Airport and major hotels/stations.

- Taxis are reliable but costly.
- Useful late at night when trains stop running (around midnight).
- Can be hailed on the street or booked via apps like JapanTaxi, GO Taxi.

& Bicycles (Popular & Convenient)

- Osaka is a bike-friendly city with many rental options.
- HELLO CYCLING and Osaka Bike Share offer easy rentals.

Ferries (For Sightseeing & Some Routes)

- Osaka Aqua-Liner: A river cruise around Osaka Castle.
- Captain Line: Connects Universal Studios (USJ) to Osaka Aquarium.
- Tempozan Ferries: Free ferry between Tempozan and USJ.

Airport Transfers

- Kansai Airport Express "Haruka" (Fastest to Kyoto & Tennoji).
- Nankai Rapi:t (Fastest to Namba).
- Limousine Bus (Easiest with luggage).

3. Kansai Railway Pass (Best for Multi-City Travel)







- ✔ Price: 2-Day: ¥5,600 / 3-Day: ¥7,000
- ✓ Unlimited rides on Osaka Metro, private railways (Hankyu, Kintetsu, Keihan, Nankai, etc.), and buses
- Covers Kyoto, Nara, Kobe, Himeji, Wakayama, and Koyasan!
- ✓ Discounts at 300+ attractions
- NOT valid on JR trains or Shinkansen.

4. JR Kansai Area Pass (For JR Train Travelers)





- ✔ Price: 1-Day: ¥2,800 / 2-Day: ¥4,800 / 3-Day: ¥5,800 / 4-Day: ¥7,000
- ✓ Unlimited rides on JR trains in the Kansai region, including: JR Osaka Loop LineJR lines, Kansai Airport Express "Haruka" (to/from Kansai Airport)
- NOT valid on subways or private railways.

5. ICOCA Card (Prepaid IC Card)





- ✔ Price: ¥2,000 (includes ¥500 refundable deposit)
- ✓ Works on all trains, subways, buses (like a Suica/Pasmo card)
- Can be used all over Japan
- Can recharge the card at ticket vending machines
- TIP: If you're traveling beyond Kansai (to Tokyo, Hiroshima, etc.), ICOCA is better than buying multiple day passes.

- 1. Osaka Castle (Osaka-jo) A stunning castle with a museum inside, surrounded by a beautiful park.
- 2. Shitenno-ji Temple Japan's oldest Buddhist temple, founded in 593.
- 3. Sumiyoshi Taisha A picturesque Shinto shrine with distinctive architectural style.

Modern Attractions

- 4. Umeda Sky Building A futuristic skyscraper with a floating garden observatory.
- 5. Abeno Harukas Japan's tallest skyscraper, offering panoramic views.
- 6.<mark>Osaka Aquarium Kaiyukan</mark> One of the largest aquariums in the world.
- 7. TeamLab Botanical Garden Osaka A digital art experience blending nature and technology.

Entertainment, Shopping & Food

- 8. Dotonbori A lively area famous for neon lights, street food, and the Glico Man sign.
- 9. Kuromon Ichiba Market A food market known as "Osaka's Kitchen," featuring fresh seafood, wagyu beef, sushi, and more.
- 10.Shinsaibashi Shopping Street A major shopping district with high-end brands and boutiques.
- 11. Amerikamura (American Village) A trendy area with vintage shops and street fashion.

- 12. Universal Studios Japan (USJ) A must-visit theme park featuring Super Nintendo World and Harry Potter attractions.

- Covers: Tokyo Metro & Toei Subway lines.
- ✓ Validity: Choose from 24, 48, or 72-hour passes.
- ✓ Best for: Tourists who plan to travel within central Tokyo using the subway.

2. JR Tokyo Wide Pass (3 Days)





- ✔ Price: ¥15,000 (adults), ¥7,500 (children).
- Covers: Unlimited rides on JR East trains (including Shinkansen & limited express) in the Kanto region.
- ✓ Validity: 3 consecutive days.
- ✓ Best for: Travelers who want to explore beyond Tokyo (e.g., Mt. Fuji, Nikko).

3. JR Tokyo 1-Day Pass (Tokyo Free Ticket)





- ✔ Price: ¥1600 (adults), ¥800 (children).
- ✓ Covers: Unlimited rides on JR EAST lines, Tokyo Metro / Toei Subway, Nippori-Toneri Liner, Tokyo Sakura Tram(Toden Arakawa Line), Toei Bus: all buses

(exc. late night buses and reserved seat buses)

✓ Validity: 1 day.

4. Greater Tokyo Pass (5 Days): Online Pass







- ✔ Price: ¥6,500 (adults), ¥3,250 (children).
- Covers: Unlimited rides on all private railways, subways, and buses in the Tokyo metropolitan area.
- Validity: 5 consecutive days.
- Best for: Tourists visiting many areas outside central Tokyo (e.g., Yokohama, Hakone, Chiba).
- NOT valid on certain train lines, including JR lines and the Tokyo Monorail, as well as buses not operated by Toei.

5. Tokyo Hop-on Hop-off Bus (Sky Hop Bus)





- Price: 24-hour pass: ¥4,800 (adults), ¥2,400 (children) 48-hour pass: ¥7,000 (adults), ¥3,500 (children)
- ✓ Type: Open-top double-decker bus
- ✓ Routes: 3 loops (BLUE, RED & GREEN) covering major tourist attractions
- ✓ Languages: Multilingual audio guides available

5. Suica/PASMO (Prepaid IC Cards)







- ✓ Deposit: ¥500 (refundable when returning the card).
- Covers: Almost all trains, subways, and buses in Tokyo
- ✓ Validity: No expiration (can be refunded before leaving Japan).
- Best for: Tourists who want flexibility and ease of use without worrying about tickets.

- Winter (December-February): Ideal for skiing(Hokkaido)&hot springs (Onsen)

Transportation

Japan Rail Pass (JR Pass)
 Best for long-distance travel (e.g., Tokyo → Kyoto → Osaka → Hiroshima).
 7, 14, or 21-day passes available.

Not valid for Nozomi & Mizuho Shinkansen (use Hikari or Sakura instead).

- IC Cards (Suica/Pasmo/ICOCA): For trains, buses, and even vending machines.
- Subway & Buses: Efficient in cities like Tokyo & Kyoto.
- Taxis: Expensive but useful late at night.
- Bicycles: Popular in cities like Kyoto.

Connectivity & Apps

- SIM Card/Pocket WiFi: Buy at the airport or online.
- Google Maps: Best for navigation.
- Hyperdia/NAVITIME: For train schedules.
- Google Translate: Useful for menu translations.
- · LINE: Popular messaging app in Japan.

Budget & Costs

Budget travelers: \$50-100 per day

Mid-range: \$100-250 per day

· Luxury: \$250+ per day

Money Tips

- Most places accept credit cards, but carry cash for small shops.
- ATMs in 7-Eleven (Convenience Store) and post offices accept foreign cards.


